Memories of My Visit to Venice, (1986), Steffen Thomas Museum of Art, Permanent Collection



When Steffen Thomas passed away in 1990, he left his wife, Sara Douglass Thomas, and their four children the summation of a prolific artistic career. Nurturing a vision of a museum dedicated to the preservation of her husband's art, Mrs. Thomas wanted to turn the Thomas home in Midtown Atlanta into a studio museum. After this was found to be impossible because of zoning and infrastructure issues, the Thomas family decided to build on land owned by the oldest son in rural Morgan County, near Madison, Georgia. In 1995, Mrs.
