

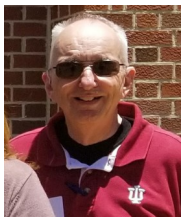

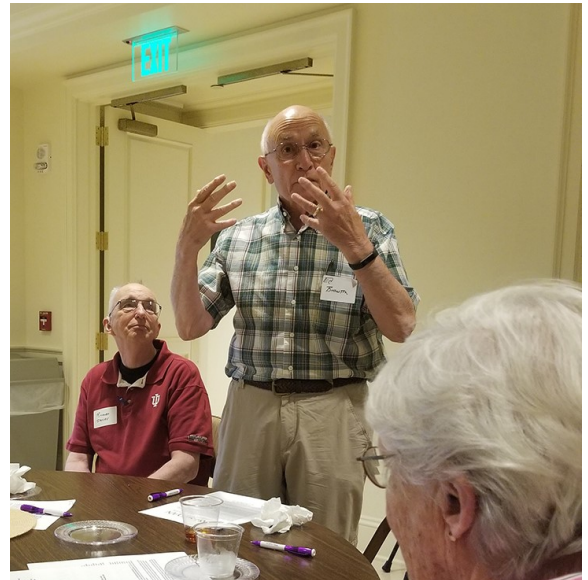
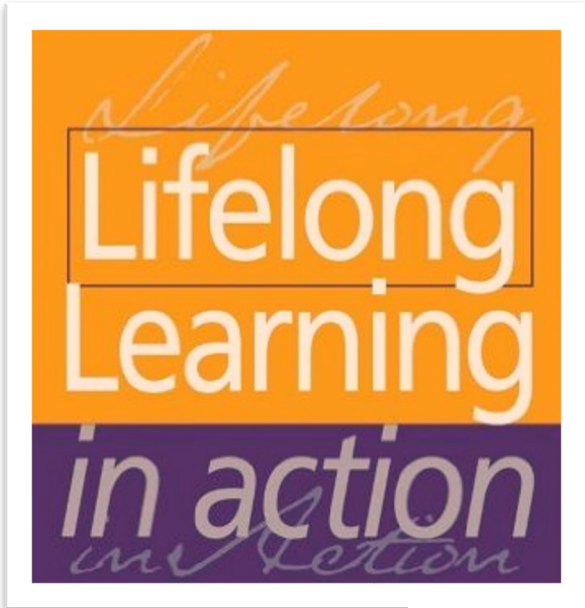

VOLUNTEER OF THE YEAR

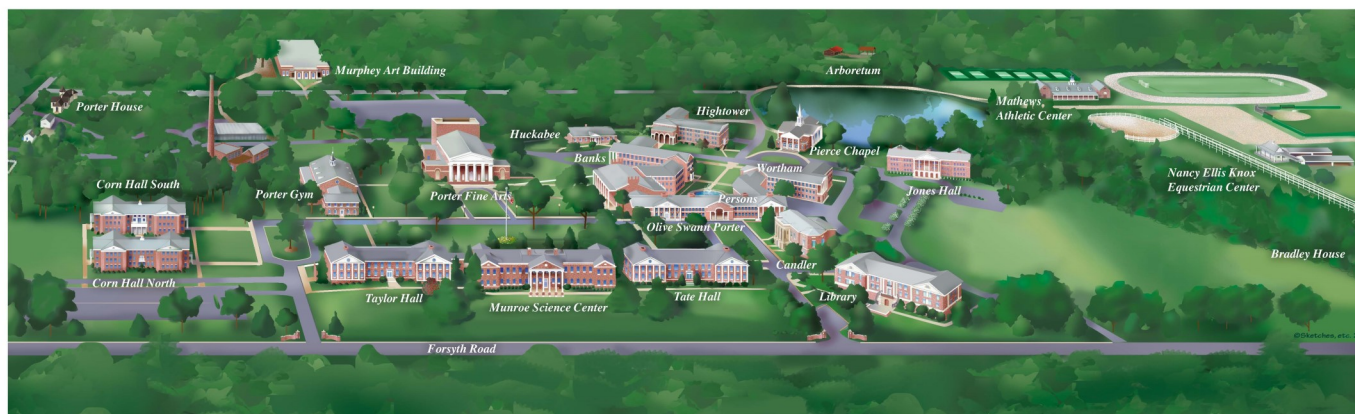
